Patient is depressed. She lies in bed with her eyes closed speaking in a low monotonous voice and, apparently, unwillingly. She attends to what is said and her replies are coherent & relevant. Her memory is somewhat impaired: though, on the whole, she gives a fair account of herself. She remembers people and incidents connected with her former stay here: but does not know how long she has been here this time nor how long she has lived with her present paramour. She denies having threatened suicide. Burns to drunken habits. She has hallucinations of hearing: can hear the paramour's voice constantly but cannot distinguish words: says she was put away by him that he might go with another woman. Has not been impulsive here.

 Patient though very dull and quiet is improving. Her memory is getting better, she is industrious and more interested in her surroundings. B.H. fair B.H.  
 Patient has steadily improved. She is brighter and has begun to take an active part in the work of the ward. She gives a better account of herself. She retains her hallucinations of hearing. B.H. good B.H.  
 Patient now states that she has lost her hallucinations of hearing. She converses rationally coherently and cheerfully & is a willing worker. B.H. good B.H.  
 Patient has continued to do well. She has been moved into a convalescent ward where she is a well behaved woman, who gives a good account of herself, and who works well. B.H. good B.H.  
 Patient has continued quiet well behaved and industrious and converses rationally. She says she has lost her hallucinations. B.H. good B.H.
